Though we tried to be as complete as possible, this document is only a sampling of the programs in which Ohio State participates with our schools.

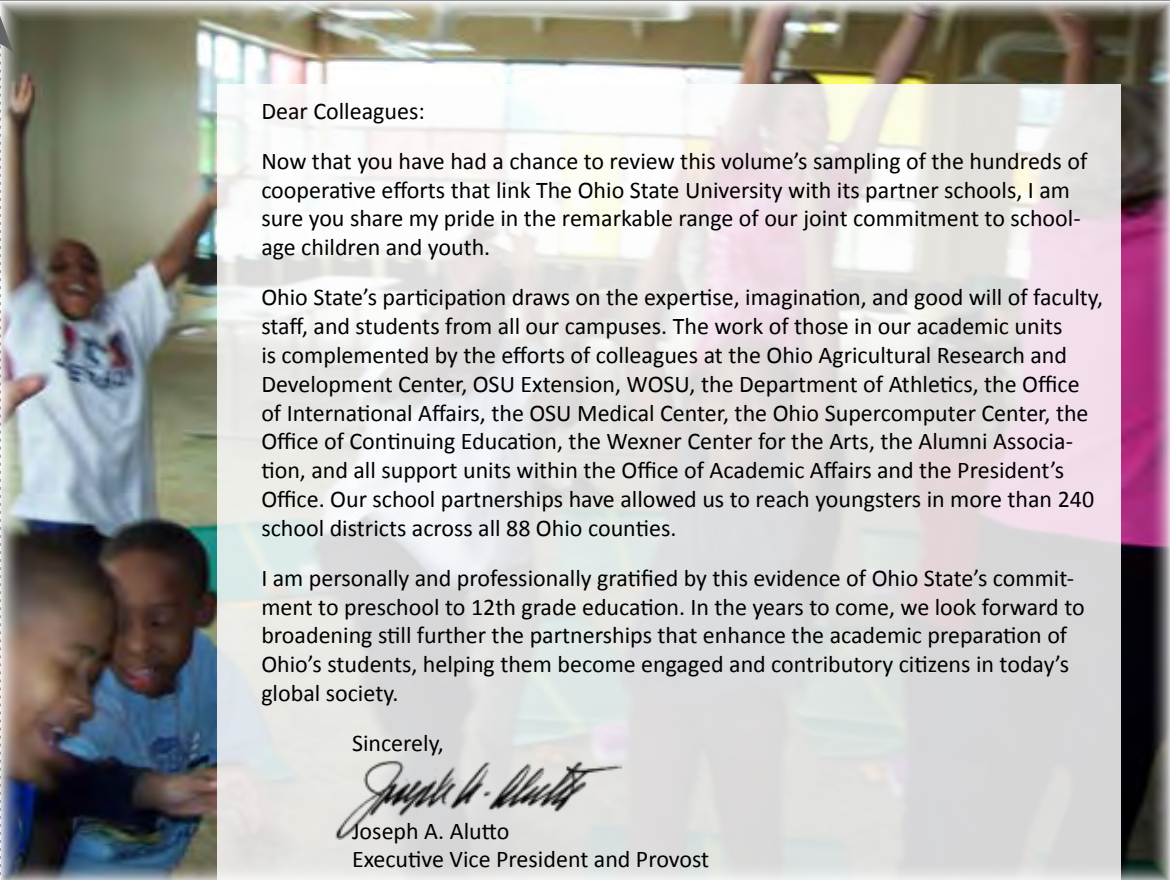
