

# Complete your senior year of high school while completing your freshman year of college!



**Seniors to Sophomores** is a dual enrollment program that enables academically qualified high school seniors to earn a year's worth of high school and college credit simultaneously – for FREE.

Participating students have the opportunity to complete up to one year of college – 24 semester or 36 quarter hours – and enter a “University System of Ohio” college at a second-year level, as college sophomores.

## Seniors of the Class of 2009 who meet specific criteria are eligible!

Applicants must have passed all parts of the Ohio Graduation Test, as well as:

- Completed Algebra II or equivalent with a letter grade of “C” or better, and
- Completed three years of high school English with a letter grade of “C” or better.

Students may be required to take a college entrance exam to be considered at some of the partner colleges and universities listed below. All student applicants will also be required to have a personal interview with a parent or guardian present to outline all conditions of the program.
